# Review of Buildings Committee Report

- One of the purposes of the S&E Committee is to ensure that “social [including economic] functions and needs ... drive requirements for the built environment.” Thus, our Committee should ensure that the CPG 6-step process helps to achieve this.
- The Buildings Committee has six scenarios that couple a specific hazard with a community that is facing that hazard. They developed a template to capture information aligned with the 6-step process, focusing on buildings and facilities.
