- Focused on beginning to identify information needed to fill gaps:
 - Overcoming the insulation of the underserved from those who can take action
 - Developing means to engage communities
 - Getting resilience into decision-making and existing plans
 - Understanding risk and translating that understanding into action
 - Effective messaging
 - Developing a business case for resilience
 - Breaking down the barriers between bureaucratic silos
- Completed dry run interdependencies exercise within committee before doing it

Interdependencies

- **General impression:** +++! Kudos to Laura Clemons (and rest of Gang of Five)!
- “High energy” items:
 - Need to use existing BCP framework (e.g., BIA – residences)
 - Identifying interdependencies / impacts is like eating an elephant.
 - Look at community supply chains
 - Measures of social capital at neighborhood level
 - “Self-organization” – what can / should we (individuals, families, neighbors) do to cope when services are lost?
