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S & E Committee Goal - 1

- Goal: Provide feedback on NIST evaluation of CRPG implementation, so gaps and barriers are identified and what worked well is spotlighted
 - Areas for feedback:
 - Fidelity to 6-step process
 - Conducted activities
 - Achieved outputs and outcomes
 - Protocols (interview instrument, methods, analysis and interpretation)
 - Reports
 - Identify other resilience initiatives to consider during the evaluation process
 - Publicizing and disseminating evaluation results (e.g., articles, presentations)
 - Other activities to support the evaluation process

S & E Committee Goal - 2

- Goal: Working with B & F Committee, alert them to the S&E considerations to incorporate use into building design (interdependencies of building clusters, S&E functions)
 - Meet and identify activities based on discussion outcome
 - Interdependencies
 - Continuity of function
 - Building use continuum (e.g., blue sky to disaster to post disaster back to blue sky)
 - Buildings as broader promotion of social capital
 - Assess building use by potential social/economic impacts (e.g., hotels as a major employer in USVI)
 - Consolidate questions and provide “whole of committee” input

S & E Committee Goal - 3

Goal: Determine how the Decision Support Framework informs the development of the S&E FY18 Work Plan.

- Context for Risk Management (provided by Bret Barclay):
 - Avoid risk
 - Mitigate risk
 - Transfer risk
 - Accept risk
- Work with other committees to achieve Panel goal using the Buildings & Facilities interaction as a model
